A Unique Ecosystem

The MNWR, created in 1995, is the Cape's second largest open, accessible conservation land, behind only the National Seashore. It encompasses unique fish and wildlife habitats, including salt marshes, Atlantic white cedar swamps, vernal pools, pitch pine barrens, shrubs and forested uplands, and freshwater marshes.



It is a stopover in the migratory path for many species of birds and insects such as the monarch butterfly. You might even spot a Snowy owl during the winter months.


Several species of amphibians, mammals, reptiles, invertebrates, and birds make this refuge their permanent home, here on Cape Cod. A number of threatened and endangered plants and animals also find protection within the Refuge.
