

- The Mashpee National Wildlife Refuge, created in 1995, is the second largest open, accessible conservation land on Cape Cod (nearly 6,000 acres!)
- The Refuge Partnership:













- Ecosystems include pine barrens, Atlantic white cedar (AWC) swamps, dry oak forests and tidal estuaries.
- Visit our pollinator gardens and learn about Cape Cod native plants, migrating monarchs, rare moths and butterflies, bumblebees and hummingbirds.



Our Mission

- FMNWR's mission: To raise awareness and provide support for the Mashpee National Wildlife Refuge and its Partners and to preserve and protect our natural resources.
- We help to ensure the long-term protection and enhancement of native wildlife and habitats.

Key 2023 Accomplishments and Activities

Earth Day 2023 – A full month!

- Planted trees at Pickerel Cove with Mashpee Conservation and AmeriCorps Seniors.
- Purchased and potted hundreds of bareroot plants for future planting at pollinator gardens throughout Mashpee Refuge.
- Managed Pollinator field plantings at FR&GC with Boy and Girl Scout Troops.













Osprey Cam

- Managed "Season Two" of live streaming osprey cam at the Waquoit Bay Reserve.
- Coordinated emergency replacement of nest platform early in the season.
- Nesting pair ("Rachel" and "Carson") successfully raised two chicks to fledge in 2023.





- Continued work with the Wampanoag Tribal Youth "Preserve our Homeland" Camp.
- Created a new wetland pollinator and medicinal plant garden at a newly-cleared site near the Santuit River at the Wampanoag Tribal Farm.
- FMNWR was awarded USFWS Retirees Assoc Mini Grant to cover partial costs of POH plants.









Visitor Center

Continued efforts for the establishment of a Mashpee NWR Visitor Center:

- Efforts currently focusing on site at 966 Falmouth Road
- Received endorsement from Mashpee Conservation Commission
- Received endorsement and authorization by the Mashpee Select Board to continue planning
- Currently investigating building/site design options
- Exploring funding sources (CPA, etc.)





 Sponsored Eagle Scout project to build two New England Cottontail rabbit habitats on Refuge Partner lands













Co-sponsored 2nd annual WFTW, a 5k challenge, with Mashpee Recreation and Conservation departments, including a highly successful celebration event at Naukabout Brewery.











- Presented an educational program at the Mashpee Senior Center, "Attracting & Raising Monarch Butterflies."
- Completed a request by Trustees of Reservations to donate and plant 39 pollinator friendly plants to their field on Old Barnstable Road in Mashpee.
- Engaged with the public at the Town-wide Mashpee
 Oktoberfest event.















